Children's Government Affairs, Medicaid Strategy and PCMH teams will advocate for and support funding, legislation, regulations, and policies that improves access to high-quality mental health services for Colorado youth	<ul> <li>In progress</li> <li>During the 2023 legislative session, Children's Colorado's Government Affairs, Medicaid Strategy and PCMH teams collaborated on over 34 amendments on 14 bills, coordinated testimony from 28 experts at committee hearings, submitted 10 letters on pending legislation, and empowered constituents to send 2,520 emails to state lawmakers.</li> <li>These legislative efforts led to a strong voice for Colorado kids on several polices, including House Bill 23-1269 to improve</li> </ul>
